

## 05-11-20 COVID-19 OPERATIONAL NOTICE

Pursuant to Governor Herbert's 04-29-20 Executive Order, effective 05-01-20, alcohol and food establishments may choose to open for dine-in/on-premises service, but only if they follow all public health phased guidelines. We are currently in Phase **Orange**.

If there is a conflict between the 04-29-20 Executive Order and your local health department, Governor Herbert's Executive Order controls unless he has authorized a political subdivision (county or city) to do something different. ### **TO ALL LICENSEES WHO ELECT TO CLOSE OR REMAIN CLOSED:**

On 05-08-20, Governor Herbert issued an Executive Order suspending the enforcement of Utah Code Ann. §32B-5-309, which is the statute that governs closure. While this executive order remains in effect, licensees are not required to inform DABC if they elect to remain closed while COVID-19-related regulations are in effect.

### **TO ALL LICENSEES WHO WILL BE OPERATIONAL:**

**Continued or New Operation**: Please note: You may only serve alcohol as governed by the laws for your particular type of license. Governor Herbert's 04-29-20 Executive Order does not modify legal requirements relating to alcohol service.

**No licensees** may offer curbside alcohol sales or service. **No retail licensees** may deliver alcohol or give to a third party (e.g. Uber Eats, Grub Hub, etc.) for delivery. **All alcohol orders and purchases must occur inside the licensed premises.** Alcohol not in use must be stored pursuant to statutory requirements.
